



Dear Parent of a Kindergartner, First Grader or Second Grader:

Students are invited to participate in this optional Reading Incentive Program sponsored by the OES Library – the SSYRA Jr. (Sunshine State Young Readers Award Jr.) The goal is to promote a reading routine and develop their vocabulary while becoming a fluent and confident reader.

Each time your child reads one of these 15 state nominated books, takes the AR test earning 70% or higher, they will earn a brag tag, representing each book (K parents will email the teacher when the student reads the book with comprehension until they start taking AR tests). Families are encouraged to read with the student.

It is the responsibility of all students to advise the classroom teacher after taking each test so they can update their SSYRA Jr. record card. The card will be sent to the library for fulfilment which can take up to 10 days. By reading at least 8 books, the student will be eligible to vote in our SSYRA Jr. Election that will be held in April.
